The iconic **Rock of Cashel** (Rock of the Kings) was the seat of the High Kings of Munster.

Blarney Castle was built over 600 years ago and it is here that you will have the chance to kiss the **Stone of Eloquence** after which you will never again be lost for words.

The Killarney National Park is home to the world famous Lakes of Killarney which sit beneath the highest mountain range in Ireland, **McGillicuddy's Reeks**.

The Cliffs of Moher with their magical vista have entranced visitors for many years. Rising over 700 feet at the edge of the Atlantic Ocean on a clear day they give you sight of the Aran Islands and Galway Bay.

The Burren is a rocky, other worldly place that is unique. You want have seen anything quite like it.

In **Connemara** you will visit to **Cong**, deep in the heart of **Joyce's** country and the setting of the film "**The Quiet Man**".

Athenry still has almost all its 14th century town walls, the North gate, five towers and castle, but is probably best known for the song 'Fields of Athenry' that echoes down from the terraces at almost any sporting occasion in Ireland.

The **Giant's Causeway**, Northern Ireland's iconic World Heritage Site and Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, is home to a wealth of local history and legend. What will you make of it?

In **Belfast** you can see what life was like 100 years ago at the **Ulster Folk Museum**
